

FROM THE PASTOR:

It's on to the Super Bowl for the Panthers! I'm just a little sleepy this morning as I write after staying up to watch the local professional football team's decisive victory over the Arizona Cardinals. It was a great win for the Panthers and probably an economic windfall for many of the hotels and other businesses in the area.

There may be some fans that would love to go to California and cheer on the home team. If you are, I hope you've saved up. The cheapest flight to the other coast is over six hundred dollars... one way. Then you need to rent a car to drive one hour (with light traffic) to the stadium. A room at a hotel on par with Days Inn or Red Roof goes for over \$150/ night. Of course you need to eat. A meal at McDonald's might run \$10 each.




